The Mission & Vision of Burns Lake Community Forest is to be the top performing community forest in British Columbia in providing benefits to the Province, our Shareholder, Partners, First Nations, and residents of the Lakes Timber Supply Area.

Burns Lake Community Forest Ltd. and ComFor Management Services Ltd. purchased over \$3.0 million in goods and services, 85 per cent of which were purchased locally. BLCF also provided over \$204,013 in stumpage revenue to the government.

100 percent of BLCF's fibre is harvested by local contractors.

Various community sectors engage with the community forest including the Omineca Ski Club, Burns Lake Mountain Biking Club (BLMBA), Burns Lake Paintball Association, and Burns Lake Fire Training Society.

\$274,422.56 has been donated this fiscal year (November 1, 2017, to October 31, 2018) to local education, service clubs, outdoor recreation, recreation facilities, sports teams, and events in Lakes Timber Supply Area.

Burns Lake Community Forest Ltd. harvested approximately 162,773 cubic metres (consisting mainly of dead pine) this year, supplying saw logs to Babine Forest Products Ltd., Decker Lake Forest Products Ltd., Pacific Timber Ltd., Fraser Lake Sawmills Ltd., and Sheraton Custom Milling Ltd.

BLCF planted over 1 million seedlings this year.

BI CF is SAFF Certified and Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) Certified.

BLCF is currently working under Management Plan #3, Forest Stewardship Plan, and AAC determination effective until 2020.

BLCF plans on harvesting 130,000 plus cubic metres this upcoming season. The focus will remain on stands of beetle-killed pine. BLCF is working on a long-term sustainability plan for the community forest, supported by our Management Plan commitments.

We look forward to developing our relationships with our First Nation partners and further promoting economic development in our community.
