Burns Lake Community Forest Ltd.

harvested approximately 135,000 cubic metres (consisting mainly of dead pine) this year, supplying saw logs to Babine Forest Products Ltd., Decker Lake Forest Products Ltd., Pacific Timber Ltd., Fraser Lake Sawmills Ltd., and Sheraton Custom Milling Ltd.

100 per cent of BLCF's fibre was harvested by local contractors.

BLCF treated/ site prepped an approximate 220+ hectares of a blowdown stands under the Forests for Tomorrow program, of which biomass volume was supplied to Pinnacle Pellet.

Employing a local contractor, BLCF planted over one million seedlings this year.

Two local contractors laid out approximately 100,000 cubic metres of standing volume.

BLCF received approval of the new Management Plan #3, Forest Stewardship Plan, and Allowable Annual Cut (AAC) determination effective until 2020.

Burns Lake Community Forest Ltd. and ComFor Management Services Ltd.

purchased over \$3.4 million in goods and services, 85 per cent of which were purchased locally.

BLCF also provided over \$160,000 in stumpage revenue to the government.

Various community sectors engage with the community forest including the Omineca Ski Club, Burns Lake Mountain Biking Club (BLMBA), Burns Lake Paintball Association, and Burns Lake Fire Training Society.

BLCF continues its commitment with the BLMBA on a five-year project providing funds annually to help cover much-needed maintenance costs. BLCF has a similar commitment to the Lakes District Art Council.

\$30,000 was donated to Airport Society for the Runway Re-Paving project. \$30,000 was also donated to Lakes Outdoor Recreation Society for 2016 recreation site maintenance.

BLCF advertised a new select list that is valid until 2018.

Burns Lake Community Forest Ltd. plans on harvesting 150,000 plus cubic metres this upcoming season. Focus will remain on stands of beetle-killed pine

BLCF is working on a long-term sustainability plan for the community forest, supported by our Management Plan commitments.

BLCF is also proceeding on attaining Forest Certification on the area-based tenure.

We look forward to developing our relationships with our First Nation partners and further promoting economic

development in our community.
